After September, the nomadic shepherds start moving down from the high pastures. Almost all the shepherds live in high valleys over 4200m where the nighttime temperature goes below freezing.

To offer the best opportunities to see these unspoiled beautiful areas, we provide treks from one to seven days and in different parts of Pamir. Below are some descriptions and pictures to give you an idea of some of the possible treks.

There are many places where one can trek in the beautiful nature of Tajikistan, and the eastern Pamir offers some of the world's most spectacular and magnificent landscapes. These picturesque rural treks are for active tour lovers.

The standard trekking season is short with the middle of summer being the best season to see the high-altitude eastern Pamir plateaus. The most comfortable season for wilderness trekking in the Pamir is from July to September.

Seven day trek from Bulunkul to

Bachor: During this trek you see more than ten different alpine lakes, close-up views of the snow-covered Pamir Mountains, and beautiful rivers. Ascending to over 4000m high will give you terrific photographic and panoramic opportunities. You and your support crew (your guide and porter) will be only people there with you so you will get to experience the solitude of wild nature.

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Four days trek from Bash-Gumbez to Zorkul (Victoria) lake through nomads'

pastures: During this trek you will witness the hospitality of the Nomad people. You will have a great opportunity to talk with them and get acquainted with their culture and traditions. In addition, you will get to ride a yak. Even for those who have not ridden before, it is very comfortable to be on a yak's back.

During the tek you will get to try natural yak milk and cream with hot homemade bread. During the day, while you walk you see flocks of sheep and goats as well as herds of cattle and yak grazing in the pasture around the yurts. At night you will stay together with a Nomad family in a yurt; they always welcome you with a hot tea and hot bread. Beyond the nomadic life, you will also see snowmelt-fed lakes, mountain springs, hot springs, glaciers, and snow-covered mountains over 5000m high.

Three days trek from Langar to the Engels peak meadow or from Alichur to Bashgumbez through Muzdairyk valley: During this trek you will see the famous Engels peak (6507m) in Wakhan Valley and the Hindu Kush mountain range in Pakistan. You will also see Marco Polo sheep (argali), Ibex (mountain goat) and, if you are lucky, snow leopard in the Northern Alichur mountains.

Generally, the best season for this is winter. Similarly, we also provide a bird watching tour from the end of April until early May.
